Playa del Carmen, Mexico Mission Trip

Note: This following article was a draft news release.

You might think that a week-long stay in Playa del Carmen, Mexico during our frigid Michigan winter might be considered a vacation. "Well, it was warmer there than here," says Grand Rapids Optometrist Gary Anderson, "but we were working 10-hour days in an outdoor gymnasium, so there wasn't much leisure involved."

The annual mission trip, coordinated by the Grand Rapids Lions Club, traveled to the Mexican state of Quintana Roo in February of this year and, despite its exotic-sounding name, the village of Playa del Carmen sits low on the rungs of Mexico's economic scale.

The purpose of the trip was to set up a complete vision clinic for the residents, most of whom had never been seen by a vision professional previously and had also never had access to corrective eyewear. The 27 member team of Lions club members from West Michigan included five optometrists, a medical internist, and additional volunteer support staff from all walks of life. Aided by the local Lions Club of Playa del Carmen, four days of temporary vision clinic were conducted in a covered outdoor gymnasium. The team provided complete eye/vision exams for the local population and dispensed the donated and gently-used eyeglasses collected by Lions clubs throughout the state of Michigan.

In advance of each annual mission, the Grand Rapids Lions Club takes possession of the donated glasses and holds weekly work sessions in a Kentwood warehouse to sort, wash, measure, and catalogue the eyewear. This year, 10,000 pairs were shipped ahead to the mission site in January.

Project chairperson, Brent Spoelstra, considers this year's trip a huge success. "We performed eye exams for 2100 citizens in Playa del Carmen, providing glasses—often for the first time—to those who needed them," he reports. Patients that needed eye surgeries were also identified and arrangements were made with the local Lions Club to assist with the surgeries. "Even with our return to Michigan's snow and freezing temps, I think everyone felt a little warmer inside from the success of our trip."

Lions Combined Districts 11-C1/11-E1 Convention

At the business meeting on Saturday afternoon (2:00 pm), the Grand Rapids Lions Club will have 9.9 votes at the business meeting (see Note below). Any member can be a delegate. The Club will pay for the \$10 registration fee to the conference, if we pay by the March 14. Food and lodging will be the member's responsibility.

The Park Place Hotel is offering a \$69 rate (+ tax) and may continue to offer this rate after the February 27 deadline as long as space is available. Rooms are blocked off under Lions District 11-E1's name when you make your reservation.

Note: "Each club gets a minimum of 1 delegate per club for voting at the district convention. Clubs will also receive 1 delegate for every 10 members, or major fraction thereof, with 1 year and 1 day of being a Lion." The Grand Rapids Lions Club have currently has 101 members, but only 99 members qualify under the definition just stated.
