Tuesday, April 7 Cuba Before Castro, Cuba Since Castro, Cuba – What Now? Carlos Hidalgo

Some Lions members remember 1959 and the era after Castro and the communists seized control of Cuba and the era that followed. Some Lions members only read about it in history books. More recently, President Obama made the decision that the policy of boycotts and lack of engagement hadn't worked in over 50 years and has opened up talks with the Cuban government to try normalize relations and try to help the Cuban people.

Carlos Hidalgo will join us today to talk about Cuba, as the title suggests. Mr. Hidalgo has widespread experience in Latin America. He developed a go-to-market strategy and distribution

network for Logoi (publishing) that resulted in market share gains in Mexico, Central and South America. He also developed and implemented a strategic market positioning program for the Government Tourist Office of Mexico, which helped position Mexico as the top tourist destination for U.S. travelers.

He is President of Hidalgo & DeVries, Inc. and brings more than three decades of expertise developing research programs and national strategic go-to-market and product launches for a wide array of Fortune 500 and mid-market companies. Mr. Hidalgo has served as an executive manager and has a broad experience overseeing marketing and research campaigns for organizations such as Time Inc., ADP and Sharp. He has also spent much of his career developing research, organizational management and marketing programs for companies such as SpartanNash, Thomson Reuters, Michelin North America, Display Pack, Medtronics and Oppenheimer Funds, among others.
