Tuesday, October 14 West Michigan Whitecaps, Scott Lane

The West Michigan Whitecaps 20th season has ended. The team didn't get very far into the playoffs this year, but they did in several years, winning 5 Midwest League Championships.

When the West Michigan Whitecaps began play in the Grand Rapids area in 1994, it was the culmination of a 10-year labor of love for local businessmen Lew Chamberlin and Dennis Baxter. The two had taken on the challenge of bringing a minor league baseball team to the area in 1984 and in February 1993, finally reached announced the purchase of the Midwest League's Madison Muskies franchise, with the intent to move the team the following year to Comstock Park, Michigan.

Some of you may recall that they ran a lengthy "Name the Team Contest" to allow the West Michigan public to cast their vote for a name for the team. The contest received 1,800 entries and ended when Chamberlin and Baxter selected the name Whitecaps, and branded it with the region's name. Scott Lane, Whitecaps President, will talk to us about the team and, perhaps, what the future holds.



A Brief Glimpse of History of the Area's Professional Basement (from the Whitecaps website):

"Until the West Michigan Whitecaps began their inaugural season in 1994, Grand Rapids had been without a professional baseball team for 40 years, since the Grand Rapids Chicks disbanded in 1954. But, Grand Rapids has a strong history of baseball as more than 30 professional teams, both men's and women's, and dozens of amateur leagues have called this area home **since 1883**.

The original professional team in Grand Rapids was organized in late 1882 and played as a charter franchise in the Northwestern League in 1883. The team had no nickname and played home games at Recreation Park on weekdays and at Alger Park on Reeds Lake on weekends. Other teams, playing in a variety of leagues, went by such nicknames as Furnituremakers, Rustlers, Gold Bugs, Ganzeloids, Braves, Black Sox, Bissell Sweepers, Bill-Eds, Billberts, Billbobs, Dodger Colts, Chicks, Orphans, Jets and Joshers."

Other Lion's News:

Club Finances: As most of you know, the club has two separate financial accounts. One is the *General Fund*, which reflects the finances for the operation of the club for meetings and other expenses. This is where our dues go. This fund is in good shape as we started the year. The other account is the club's *Activities Commission*, which is our charitable fund where the expenses and revenues are reported as we raise funds for our charitable giving.

This *Activities Commission* is also the account where the distributions are transferred from our endowment (Foundation Fund) at the Grand Rapids Community Foundation. As of June 30, 2014, the GRLC Foundation Fund at the Grand Rapids Community Foundation was valued at just over \$571,000. With ongoing contributions every year and increasing value in the investments, the club is getting closer to its goal of a million dollar endowment for our charities.
