His role at the Foundation is to increase awareness of the life, career, values and legacy of America's 38th President. This is accomplished through the Foundation support of permanent and changing exhibits at the Presidential Library and Museum which promote historical literacy, conferences, educational outreach and other programs (both scholarly and popular).

During Mr. Calvaruso's tenure at the Foundation, his leadership roles have included the ceremonies to unveil the Statue of President Ford in the U.S. Capitol Rotunda and tributes to First Lady Betty Ford when she passed away in 2011, and the Campaign for the Legacy of Gerald R. Ford to build a student learning center and centennial events in tribute to President Ford's 100th Birthday. He has led the effort to bring prominent speakers to the Library and Museum through conferences, educational outreach and other public programming.

Prior to joining the Foundation, he was a Banker for over 29 years. His last position in banking was with Mercantile Bank of Michigan, where he was Senior Vice President and Director of Risk Management. He is a Trustee for Albion College, Board Member and Vice Chairman of Michigan Certified Development Corporation, and has served on numerous community and professional committees. He is a graduate of Albion College and Western Michigan University.
