## Tuesday, May 24 Opportunities Unlimited for the Blind Gwen Botting

Opportunities Unlimited for the Blind (OUB) programs help people with visual impairments to develop skills of blindness, helping them become competent, confident, contributing, tax paying, working adults. OUB provides summer camps and work experiences that focus on educational goals. It utilizes teaching methods and strategies that encourage campers to be as confident and independent as possible, safely, while keeping learning fun! Its goal is that every child, teen, young adult and adult with or without a visual impairment who comes to OUB Camps or works for OUB learns self-reliance skills and expands their dreams for their future success.

OUB partners with Camp Optimist, which has a day lodge, sports fields, teaching kitchen, tent platforms, and shower building. The camp also features our camp garden. It also partners with Indian Trails Camp for recreational activities that include swimming, boating, and rock climbing. Together, the two camps have ecodiversity with unlimited potential as "the" place to develop a love for swimming, boating, hiking and exploring while learning about nature, developing mobility and orientation skills, activities in daily living, and social skills.

OUB's Executive Director, Gwen Botting, will talk to us today about the mission and activities. She was the President of Michigan Parents of Children with Visual Impairments for 12 years and the parent of a blind college student. Gwen has served on the OUB Board of Directors for several years and oversees the operation of the organization.

Gwen is a graduate of Knox College and Calvin College. Gwen and her husband, Jim, have two children: Greg, who is blind, graduated from Alma College. Greg spent his second semester of his sophomore year attending the University of Aberdeen in Scotland. They live in Ionia, MI.
