### Tuesday, December 5 Social Security Administration, Vonda Van Til

The Social Security Act was signed into law by President Franklin Roosevelt on August 14, 1935. In addition to several provisions for general welfare, the new Act created a social insurance program designed to pay retired workers age 65 or older a continuing income after retirement.

Taxes were collected for the first time in January 1937 and the first one-time, lump-sum payments were made that same month. Regular ongoing monthly benefits started in January 1940.

The Grand Rapids Social Security Office, located on Knapp Street across from Meijer, determines:

- Eligibility and pays benefits to those entitled to survivor benefits;
- Eligibility and pays benefits to the entitled legally blind.
- Eligibility and pays retirement benefits to those entitled aged 62 and older.

Parents or guardians usually can apply for blind or disabled children under age 18. In some cases, other third parties can apply for children. Visit www.socialsecurity.gov for more information.

Vonda Van Til, Public Affairs Specialist, will talk to us today about the Social Security Administration. After 26 years at Social Security, she has mastered the art of entertaining while teaching. Ms. Van Til is a West Michigan native and a graduate of Aquinas College, with a dual major in business and communications. Public speaking, webinars, newspaper articles and radio interviews (i.e., The Morning Show with Shelley Irwin) are just a few of the ways she educates and informs the public about their Social Security benefits. She is also a wife and mother to three.

#### Looking Back - Grand Rapids Lions Club - Last Months of 1946

As we approach our 100th anniversary in 2019, and as the club looks forward, this series of articles looks back on the activities of the club, this time drawing upon some of the earliest Nuda Veritas editions that we have in our archives from 1947. (Editions missing after April 1947)

The Tuesday weekly luncheons continued at the Pantlind Hotel. Here are a few programs:

- A newer member of the Club arranged to have the "snappiest singing group in the city [perform] and from all reports that we have heard they are just that . . . the Creston High School Sextette,"
- Harry Keehan, a chemist in the Research Department of Phillip Morris, talked to the club "on the tobacco industry during the war, how it came out of the war, the future of the industry, some anecdotes as well as methods used in merchandizing and advertising." [What would he have said at that time?]
- Jim Spindle, Michigan Consolidated Gas Company, spoke to the club "about the new pipe line from Texas and other facts of interest regarding the gas situation in general. Bringing natural gas a few thousand miles from Texas looks to us like whale of a job. Jim will tell us how big a task it really is going to be."
- It was announced "... that the State [Lion] Convention, consisting of District 11 A, B, C and D will be held in Grand Rapids on May 17, 18 and 19."
- "Practically all the important people in this man's town belong to the Lions Club." On one Tuesday, the Lions honored Frank Burns, Fire Department Chief, "every inch a fireman." It noted, "It wasn't so long ago that Frank joined our outfit."
- Bert Brandt, General Sales Manager in Detroit for the Michigan Bell Telephone Company, spoke about the "mobile radiotelephone service which has been introduced in the Detroit Metropolitan Area . . . and plans to extend mobile service to Grand Rapids and other cities . . ."

The Nuda Veritas also had numerous interesting comments, observations, and facts on Lion issues, including:

- "The most elaborate Ladies Night the Lion Club has ever experienced is all planned for the evening of January 28...followed by the finest entertainment ever staged before the Club... {followed] by dancing in the Grill Room."
- "Dirty penny bottles" [for the blind] were replaced" nice shiny new ones. There was encouragement to bring in "a whole flock more around town" used for people to donate their pennies.
- An example of the "Blind Committee's" activities was described in one newsletter: "Your Mr. Merrill gets a call. Mrs. Wilson up on Michigan Hill is out of food. Mrs. Wilson is blind. She has a large family, [but] she has no food in the house. Charlie calls up George Hertel. Gentlemen, in exactly one (1) hour, Mr. Hertel was up to Mrs. Wilson's home (and it isn't a beautiful cabin nestled in the pines) in fact there is something about a ladder involved, but George wasn't too busy at the wrong time to do this little job."
- "He is Our Boy" was the title of the article. "... Carl Richards [a Lion] is a candidate to succeed himself as Commissioner of the Second Ward. Carl has most certainly been active on the Commission and should be returned to the office ..."
- An article announced the 1947 Lions Club Cruise starting on the afternoon of June 5<sup>th</sup>.
- Knapp & Vogt continued to get accolades for the regular donations of "coppers" this time doubling their previous donations.
