The annual Grand Rapids Lions Club's Student Recognition Day is a long-standing tradition. Originally, the Lions recognized only the boys' championship teams in football, basketball and baseball. Beginning around the 1970's, girls' basketball teams and all-stars began to be recognized. At today's meeting, Grand Rapids area senior students will be recognized for their accomplishments in school and in the community. We will celebrate their achievements in the 21st year in this format that recognized over-all abilities and achievements.

Each school's leadership selects two students based on the student's all-round contribution during high school, not just in sports or academic achievement, but also for their leadership, and school & community involvement. The principal or guidance counselor from each school will typically present the students. Parents and Superintendents are invited and may attend.

Looking Back – Grand Rapids Lions Club – January 1984 through December 1985

As we celebrate our 100th anniversary in 2019, and as the club looks forward, this series of articles looks back on the activities of the club, this time drawing upon Nuda Veritas editions that we have in our archives from January 1984 through December 1985. (some editions missing)

The Tuesday weekly luncheons return to the Pantlind Hotel, now renamed the Amway Grand Plaza Hotel after it was remodeled. Here is a selection of the programs:

- Dr. Marvin DeVries, Grand Valley State Economics Professor presented the Economic Outlook for both 1984 & 1985.
- District 11-C1 Governor Oscar Anderson was a guest speaker to talk about activities in the District.
- Oh's Tae Kwon Do demonstrated this Karate & Martial Arts technique during a January luncheon.
- Sara Smolenski was our guest speaker when the Lions honored the City's girls' basketball champions, the West Catholic Girls Basketball team and the City League Girls All-stars.
- The "Fenians" entertained the Lions for our St. Patrick's Day celebration.
- Jack Lousma, former astronaut & native son of Grand Rapids, talked to the Lions about his candidacy for U.S. Senate.
- Charles Bearden of the ACLU talked about what the organization does as our Law Day program.
- Mayor Gerald Helmholdt was our guest speaker in honoring top students from the City's high schools.
- On June 12, the Lions meeting was a tour of Welcome Home for the Blind and a barbeque lunch.
- Guest speaker Mary Jane Dockeray, curator-naturalist of the Blandford Nature Center, talked about the benefits & activities of the Center.
- Dr. Bruce Chubb talked about recent innovations in aerospace technology, avionics, technology, avionic applications and computer simulations.
- Will Leeder, Association for the Blind, talked about "Technology and the Blind". The Association was sponsoring a day-long display and demonstration featuring 9 different company technologies and innovations.
- The Christmas Program featured Dr. Alexander Holmes, Club Chaplain, for the message and Susan Roh, vocalist.
- On January 15, 1995, John Brosky talked about "Journalism Today". He was the Editor of the *Grand Rapids Magazine* and the *Grand Rapids Business Journal*.
- For the Valentines Party Ladies Day, "Hearts and Flowers" was performed Norma Brink and Gerald Elliot as a special musical presentation.
- The Hope Theatre Guild displayed it "Costume Collection" during one luncheon.
- The 1985 Easter Program featured musician from the Grand Rapids Symphonies, Maria Royce on hasp and Chris Kanter on flute.
- The "Spring Sports Awards Program" honored the top girl and boy athletes from eight Grand Rapids High Schools. Dr. Anthony Diekema, Calvin College President was the guest speaker.
- Michael Lloyd, Editor, Grand Rapids Press spoke on June 11 about the news business.
- "Bright Eagle" [mural of the life of President Gerald R. Ford located at the airport] was the title of the talk by internationally renowned artists, Paul Collins. He was born in Muskegon and still lives in Grand Rapids.
- U.S. Representative Paul Henry spoke to the club about activities in Washington DC.
- Mary Jo Thiel from the Kent County Resource Recovery Program spoke to the club. This program was designed to be an alternative to putting things into the landfill.
- The Catholic Central Jazz Band played for the Lions in Grand Plaza Pantlind Ballroom.
- Lions Chaplain, Rev. Charles Fry gave his first Christmas message as a Lion [your Editor believes], followed by music from harpist Maria Royce and Sara Stoppels [wife of Lion & Judge Stoppels].

The Nuda Veritas also had numerous interesting comments, observations, and facts on Lion issues, including:

- Lion Keith Crittenden worked on a project to produce audio recordings of Jean Miller's piano playing.
- Lions volunteers participated in the Lions Booth at the Grand Rapids Home Show in both 1984 & 1985.
- A social tennis night was launched in 1984, which continued for several years.
- Kathy O'Bee was elected as the first & second President of our Lioness Club.
- The 2nd "Spring Carnival on the Mall" was held May 18-20, 1984 & the 3rd Annual on May 17-19, 1985. The "net profit" from the 1985 Carnival on the Mall was \$19,674.
- The Installation of Officers and Ladies Night Party was held at Green Ridge Country Club on June 21st.
- The summer golf & dinner outings in both 1984 & 1985 were held at these country clubs: Green Ridge, Elks, Silver Lake & Forest Hills.
- The Grand Rapids Lions Club hosted Lions International President at its 65th Anniversary Banquet at the Marriott Hotel on 28th Street on Friday, November 16, 1984. The theme of his presentation was "Answer the Call to Serve".
- Using the Lions Sightmobile, Lion volunteered to test hearing and sight of community members at the Health Expo '84 at the Grand Center. The Lioness club also fingerprinted youngsters.
- Our Lions Club sponsored a Detroit Lions Trip Package for Detroit vs Chicago football game on December 16, 1984.
- The Fruit & Nut Sale continued as a Lions fundraiser in both years.
- Lion Judge Robert Smolenski's retirement dinner was of Thursday, November 8, 1984, sponsored by the Grand Rapids Bar Association.
- In 1985, the District 11-C1 Convention was held at the Harley Hotel.
- In 1984, the Lions Club donated \$59,788 to charitable causes.
- Our Lions Club sponsored an excursion to see the Tigers vs the Yankees on June 23, 1985.
- President Ron Brady adopted the motto for Lionism 1985-86: "We serve better together."
- St. Mary's Hospital renamed their Comprehensive Health Center as the Dr. Joseph R. Lentini Health Center. Dr. Lentini was a longtime Lions member and leader of our club.
- More than 30 GR Lions provided volunteer assistance in helping the Boy Scouts celebrate their 75th Jubilee at Grand Valley State. 5,281 Scouts and leaders from 280 troops attended.
- The National Boy Scouts honored Lion and Eagle Scout Bud Magennis with its highest award, The Distinguished Eagle Scout Award.
- All Lions were invited to a New Year's Day Reception at the Pantlind Ballroom.
