TRESURER'S REPORT 2019-2020

Update Report From Your Treasurer

Our year just ended June 30, 2020. This was the most unusual year I have ever seen since I have been treasurer. We had a 100th year celebration in Nov 2019 and by Mar 2020 we were shut down due to a pandemic. The following is a recap of the financial matters of our club.

The General Fund – this is the corporation we host our lunches and parties through. Dues are billed throughout the year based on a member's status. The fund had been running small monthly deficits. Then in March all meetings were cancelled and we ended up showing a surplus for the year. Members who pre-paid for lunches have been offered a voluntary discount in the new year. Our primary revenue is from dues and was around \$34,000 with some other small sources of income. Our primary expense is meals/parking at the U Club. Other costs are dues paid to International/Michigan along with wages to the Secretary, Treasurer & Editor. The carry forward balance in this fund is \$15,673.

The Charities Fund – this is the corporation we run all our fund raisers through such as the Blind Dinner Date (BDD), Drive for Vision (DFV) and the Used Eye Glass program. Our 2 largest fundraisers, BDD & DFV have been postponed. We held the first Cars for a Cause last July and was successful because of the efforts of Pat & Deb Droste. We were able to again allocate annual amounts we receive from our funds held at the GR Community Foundation which was \$42,000. Total allocations to charities this year by our Lions Club was \$95,731 which was lower than the prior year by \$36,600 since our 2 big fund-raisers were postponed.

Our balance of funds held at the GR Community Foundation at one time was over \$1 million but was hit hard in the first part of 2020. The June 30, 2020 amount is not available yet but should have recovered to near the \$1 million dollar level. The amount of spendable funds for this year was \$42,000 and this helped us support various charities and is part of the \$95,731 allocation mentioned above.
