- The transportation is being provided by Sabbath Ministries, <u>so no transportation</u> is needed from our Lions.
- When: Saturday, Dec 5, 2020 at 8am -11 am.
- Where: Meijer on 28th & I-96 in Cascade.

Everyone has to be masked and there will be hand sanitizer available. FYI the GVSU students are not on campus or available, so volunteers are NEEDED!

Summary of what to expect this year: Meet the student at the door, shop, checkout and bring child back to the door/bus - that is it. Should go quickly.
