This week, Special Olympics held the Unified Cup in Detroit, MI. This is the World Cup of soccer for Special Olympic athletes, held every four years just like the World Cup games. Teams from 28 countries competed for the Unified Cup final played on Sat. Aug. 6. Lions Clubs International has been a financial and volunteer supporter of Special Olympics for 25 years and this event was a very special opportunity for the Lions Of Michigan. Monday night, Lions Clubs International Foundation hosted 480 players and coaches to dinner and a cruise on the Detroit Princess Riverboat. The evening gave the athletes time to meet young people from other countries in a relaxed environment. The DJ playing "music" on the third deck had them dancing and rocking all night.

We found that several of the teams were sponsored by their Lions Clubs in their home country and were very happy to meet Lions from around the world. Wednesday, the rest day with no games played, the Lions of Michigan provided a lunch in the park for all the athletes and their families. HELPING AT THE UNIFIED CUP: A MD11 PROJECT



TREASURER'S REPORT FOR YEAR END 2021-2022

Update Report From Your Treasurer

Our year just ended June 30, 2022. The following is a recap of the financial matters of our club.

The General Fund – this is the corporation we host our lunches and parties through. Dues are billed throughout the year based on a member's status. The fund typically runs small monthly deficits. Our primary revenue is from dues and was around \$27,400 with some other small sources of income. Our primary expense is meals/parking at the U Club and came in at \$9,600. Other costs are dues paid to International/Michigan along with wages to the Secretary, Treasurer & Editor. The loss for the year was (\$4,250). The carryforward fund balance to next year is \$20,300.

The Charities Fund - this is the corporation we run all our fund raisers through such as the Blind Dinner Date (BDD), Drive for Vision (DFV) and the Used Eye Glass program. The BDD netted \$16,100 and the DFV netted \$23,100. We allocate the proceeds from these events to The Association for the Blind & Vision Impaired, Cherry Street Eye Glass Center and the GR Community Foundation.

We have funds held at Grand Rapids Community Foundation. The balance at March 31, 2022 was \$1,217,052. The spendable amount for the year was \$42,200. We use this money to make grants to numerous vision/hearing charities. A separate list of the recipients was published in the NUDA in July 2022. The total amount of donations for the year from fund-raisers plus the foundation dollars was \$85,000.

Additional information is available for any member who requests it.
