IMPORTANT UPDATE TO OUR CHARITY FUNDS

Over the years our club has been building a fund at the Grand Rapids Community Foundation (GRCF).As of June 30, 2023, we have approximately \$1,200,000 in this fund. Each year the fund generates approximately \$45,000 in spendable grant making dollars. The Board uses this spendable amount to support many charities annually such as Association for the Blind & Visually Impaired. The Cherry Health Lions Club Vision Clinic at Heart of the City Health Center, Michigan Service Foundation, Bear Lake Camp, Leader Dog, Lions Club International Foundation and many more worthwhile charities. Some of the funds from GRCF help support the used eyeglass program. The arrangement with GRCF has served us well over the years but has some drawbacks. When funds are sent to GRCF, they are "in perpetuity" gifts and become the property of that foundation. The advantage of a "in perpetuity" gift is it will continue to provide annually for our charities for generations to come. A disadvantage is it provides no flexibility for use of funds for special club projects. We believe a self-managed fund can add some flexibility, improve the rate of return on investments and reduce the high costs that typically are present in a community foundation. We would like Lions members to have both options available.

Starting 6/30/23, at the request of the Board, donors will have this second option on where their donation will be held. While the GRCF "in perpetuity" gift options will remain, our club has set up a second option within the Grand Rapids Lions Club Charities corporation to hold and invest these donations. The intention of this new fund (called the Flex Fund) is to be close to a permanent foundation with an exception that will allow the Board to spend up to 25% once every 5 years of the assets on special projects that will help serve the visually impaired individuals or other community endeavors that Lions typically support. There will also be a 5% annual spendable allocation similar to the GRCF program. The advantage of this fund over the GRCF will be the assets remain under the ownership of the club and provide some flexibility as to use. The hope is that return on assets will be higher and costs to operate the fund will be lower and thereby generate more annual spendable grant dollars.

An example of how this might work somewhere down the road is let's say Cherry Health Lions Club Vision Clinic needs to renovate the vision clinic. They have requested our club support this endeavor to the tune of \$100,000. The Board could authorize say \$25,000, if assets are available, to be spent from this fund and have a fundraising drive to raise another \$25,000. Then the club would request a matching grant from Lions Club International for a total of \$100,000 toward this special project.

If you are considering a donation to the club or are setting up a will, trust or estate, you will be asked if you want your donation to be an "in perpetuity" donation and go to the Grand Rapids Community Foundation or if the donation will be held in the Grand Rapids Lions Club Flex Fund account. Guidelines on how the fund is operated are available to anyone who asks.

Importantly, for those of you who have already made commitments to "Legacy gifts" that are part of your wills and/or trusts, any such designations dated prior to June 30, 2023 will automatically go to the GRCF unless you provide clear guidance that you prefer your donation stay within the fund held by the club.

DECEMBER 2: HOLIDAY SHOPPING

Volunteers needed for in-person shopping on Saturday, December 2, 2023

Meijer generously donates a \$30 gift card per child within a total limit of \$1500 for the event. The Grand Rapids Lions Club donates \$95 per child (up up \$4750 for 50 children) to set a budget of \$125 per gift card for children to spend on their family members. "Pass the Hat" donations through through collections at Lions luncheons assist in supplementing the cost of having additional children participate. For each \$125 collected, an additional child is able to attend.

WHAT: The first shift is designated for the children with visual impairments and begins PROMPTLY at 7:15 a.m. The second group of children begin at 8:30 a.m. when the Base Camp Sabboath children arrive with their staff. ****Due to the large number of children who are being referred, we are looking for at least 35 volunteers or more, if possible, so the ratio would be no more than 2 children to every 1 volunteer.
